- 30 years of distinguished experience as a professional meteorologist 20 years of service to South Carolina
- Trusted consultant to city and county officials across the state and to the South Carolina Governor's office whenever severe weather is a threat
- Known throughout the Midlands for the accuracy of his predictions before Hurricane Isabel, the Superstorm of 1993, and the Lexington County tornado outbreak in 1994
- Going at odds with National Weather Service forecasts in 1989, Gandy held to his predication as Hurricane Hugo bore down on the state. He was right and his forecast is credited with saving lives.
