- ◆ Pioneered children's programming in 1958 with launch of "Dandyland" and later, "Circle B Ranch"
- ◆ Beloved host of the children's program "Monty's Rascals", which ran from 1961 to 1978 on WFBC-TV
- ◆ Popular host of the Miss South Carolina Pageant for 20 years
- ◆ Dedicated community service volunteer serving on many charitable organization boards and committees, including the Salvation Army, Easter Seals, and Meals on Wheels
- ◆ Recipient of South Carolina Baptist Association's Media Award in 1981
- ◆ 1974 Greenville Jaycee's Man of the Year
- ◆ Awarded Silver Medal Award in 1974 by the Greenville Advertising Federation
- ◆ Achieved exceptional ratings success as host of "Monty in the Morning", 1963 – 1986. Through the years, Mr. Du Puy originated his morning show from fascinating remote venues including World Fairs in San Antonio and Vancouver, Washington during the Watergate scandal, Constitution Hall in Philadelphia for the Bi-Centennial celebration in 1976 and on board the HMS Queen Elizabeth.
- ◆ Purchased WLBG in Laurens, relocated it to Greenville as WGXL, and increased tower height to 1,000 feet. This station now operates at 100,000 watts as WSSL-FM.
